In Mt. Laurel we are in the middle of building a building and doing a lot of fundraising to try and help with the costs of the things that will be needed inside the building: pews, pulpit, communion tables and such.

She knows this because she owns a flower shop and it was what she spent to make up 25 centerpieces for her shop. Well lo and behold I got everything for exactly \$129.54.

I then needed to recruit someone to help me make all these things up, so I called my bud and Sister, Chris Perri and I said "Hey Chris, do you want to work on a project with me?" "I sure don't know how these things are going to turn out, but I figure when we're working for the Lord we can't go wrong".

The devil is always working to try and interfere in our lives. The day before we were going to get together, Sister Chris called me and she sounded terrible. She had a horrible cold and told me if I really needed her she would help, but she wasn't feeling too well and didn't know how long she would be able to last.

I told her whatever she could give me I would take and we would do the best that we could. So the next day we started our project. We made 24 flower arrangements and when we were done, we were pleasantly surprised at how beautiful they were.

He told me that each time I think of one of these centerpieces to remember Him and what He shed for me and that when someone is doing good to support the growth of His kingdom, He will not leave them alone when they ask for help. When I woke up, I knew we would sell every centerpiece we had.

That weekend we were going over to my cousin, Tony Micale's house for his 70th birthday celebration and I had all of the centerpieces in my van. My husband Joe said that he would remove them and put them in the basement and I could try again next year". I told him, "No Joe, I have a feeling that we can sell them today."

After we got to Tony's, I started telling different ones that we were selling centerpieces to support our Church Building Fund and by the time we left, all of the centerpieces were sold along with six of our decorative food jars.

Since that time, I've had one of the centerpieces on my dining room table and 12 people that have come into my home have commented on how beautiful it is. I have told these people why I was encouraged to make them.

The one on my dining room table is one of the largest Sister Chris and I have done and we now have orders for 12 of them for next year at \$50.00 a piece!

HEALTH ALERT

DON'T LET YOUR MEDS MAKE YOU SICK!

According to a recent poll, nearly six out of 10 of us have used prescription drugs incorrectly. And even when we take our meds as instructed, unexpected side effects sometimes pop up!

The key to protecting yourself and your family? Good communication with your doctors, says pharmacist Robert Fakelmann, RPH. So the next time you're given a prescription, be sure to ask...

Is there a safer version?

Despite all the ads on television touting their powers, new medications are not always better than the old ones used to treat the same condition. "Drug companies bombard doctors with new versions of medications, which leads many physicians to prescribe them, even though the revamped option often isn't better," Fakelmann explains. To protect yourself: Ask, "Is this drug clearly more effective than older, better-known options?"

Is this the best dose for me?

Most drugs are tested on "average" sized people - men and women who weigh around 150 pounds. This can lead to overdosing for smaller folks and under dosing for larger ones, says Fakelmann. To protect yourself: Double-check that your doctor has taken your size into consideration.

Do any of my meds overlap?

More than 40% of Americans get their prescriptions from more than one doctor - and many get those prescriptions filled at multiple pharmacies. Trouble is, if a pharmacist doesn't see all of your prescriptions, he can't catch overlaps-which can lead to overmedication and other problems.

To protect yourself: "Keep a list of your medications in your wallet, and provide that information to every doctor and pharmacist you visit," urges Fakelmann.

Can I keep taking OTCs?

"Over-the-counter medications and supplements can interfere with your prescription medications, making them either more or less effective than they should be, or causing dangerous side effects," explains Fakelmann.

To protect yourself: "Tell your doctor about every single medication you takeright down to your multivitamin and the occasional aspirin," advises, Fakelmann. Article by: Camille Noe Pagan

AWARD WINNING APPLE CAKE



One of **Sister Sally Hettler's** (New Brunswick, NJ branch) famous recipes that has won blue ribbons several times is her delicious apple cake.

Mix together the following ingredients:

1 cup Crisco oil, 1 tsp. salt, 1 tsp. baking soda, 1 tsp. vanilla, 1 tsp. cinnamon, 3 large eggs lightly beaten, 1½ cups sugar, 2 cups flour, 4 large apples thinly sliced/chopped and ½ cup walnuts.

Topping: Combine ½ cup flour, ½ cup brown sugar and ¼ cup medium soft butter. Sprinkle on top of cake. Bake at 350° 50 minutes or longer, depending on oven. Check for doneness with tooth pick.
