Sis. Louann (Carson) stated that as a girl she was a member of the Junior Circle in Monongahela and in that Junior Circle she learned about visiting the sick, the shut-ins, making crafts that could be used as gifts for those same people, performed the missionary work that they could and learned to love studying the scripture from some real pillars of the Church. Sisters who gave their time to instill in these girls all the values that could be developed and begin them on the path to being pillars themselves. I encourage you to establish a Junior Circle in your branch if you have young girls who could benefit from it.
