## **Recipe Corner**

#### Judy's Orange and Pineapple Cake

1 yellow cake mix ( not the one with pudding or butter in the mix)

½ cup oil

4 eggs

2 cans mandarin oranges 8oz. drain one (I have used the publix brand it is 11 oz. so I don't use all the juice)

Beat the above ingredients together for 3 minutes.

Then pour into a 9x13 in. greased and floured pan

Bake 35-40 minutes at 350 degrees.

Let the cake cool.

Then top the cake with:

8oz. Cool Whip, 20oz. crushed pineapple, and 1 small pkg. instant vanilla pudding.
\*Beat pineapple with juice into the pudding

\*Beat pineapple with juice into the pudding for 5 minutes. Then fold in the cool whip.
